Course Description:

On average, nearly 20 people per minute are physically abused by an intimate partner in the United States; during one year this adds up to more than 10 million people. Providers have to recognize the signs and understand the dynamics of Intimate Partner Violence (IPV), and its potential impact on client's mental, physical, and spiritual wellbeing.

IPV for African American, Hispanic, and LGBTQA persons also requires an inclusive and culturally informed lens to tailor support. Content will inform on different IPV behaviors and cycles of abuse, common myths, victim responses and vicarious trauma. Also included are approaches to assessing historical trauma, review of exit strategies, and trauma informed care strategies to support victims of IPV.
