7-week series with parent/caregiver, youth, and family sessions

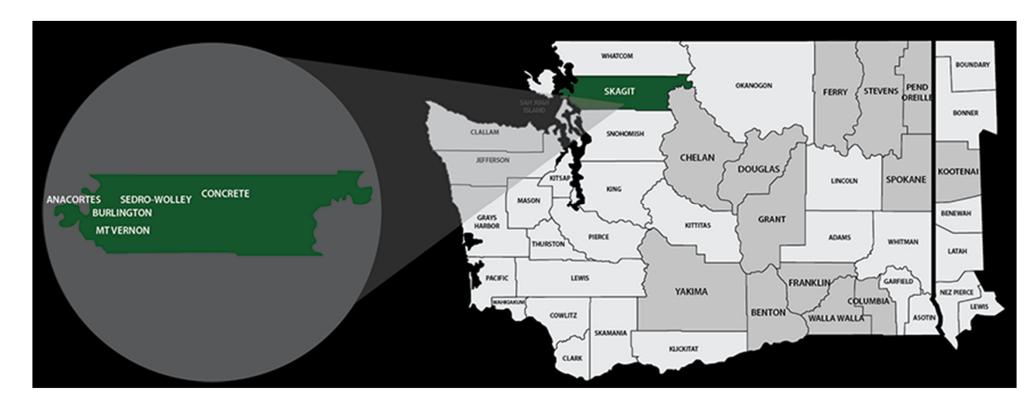
Focus on substance use prevention and building effective communication skills

#### Where is SFP/FF 10-14?

WSU contract with Skagit Public Health Department for facilitator training and 2 Spanish-language implementations.

## Why is Spanish SFP a priority?

#### **Skagit County**

- 18.6% Hispanic
- 16% Not speaking English at home
- 18% Migrant families

#### Mount Vernon Schools

- 55% Hispanic
- 76% Non-English language
- 18% Migrant worker





#### **SFP Delivery Format**

- Monday Parent Session
- Tuesday Youth & Families
- 3 Facilitators and 1 Coordinator
- Debrief Session
- Text Reminders & Follow-up
- Individual Booklets, Activity Bag

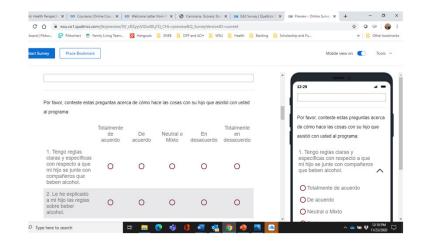

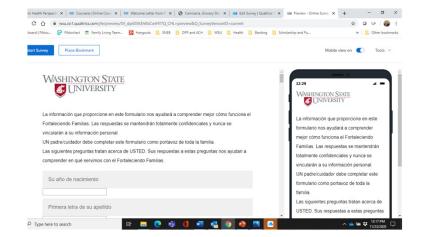
#### **Evaluation and Paperwork**

#### Feedback After the Pivot

- Online was better than in person sessions didn't have to drive to a meeting, less concern with childcare, chance to meet virtually in-person.
- Difficult to maintain attention with teens, parents multitasking.
- More time for parent session would be helpful, so many questions and comments.
- Meals were offered to families. This was a valued part of the program, families felt honored and supported.
- Families liked that the activity kits were sent home prior to the sessions. The Loteria game was great fun, an excellent learning tool.
