Each poison control center submits de-identified case data to NPDS after providing necessary poison exposure management and information services to callers. - The National Survey on Drug Use and Health provides information on tobacco, alcohol, and drug use, mental health and other health related issues in the United States. NSDUH began in 1971 and is conducted every year in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. This year almost 70,000 people will be interviewed for this important study. Information from NSDUH is used to support prevention and treatment programs, monitor substance use trends, estimate the need for treatment and inform public health policy.

### Treatment Episode Data Set (TEDS)

- The Treatment Episode Data Set provides demographic information and describes the characteristics and outcomes of treatment for alcohol and/or drug use among clients aged 12 years and older admitted to treatment at facilities throughout the 50 states, the District of Columbia, U.S. territories, and other jurisdictions. TEDS includes treatment admissions at facilities that are licensed or certified by a state substance abuse agency to provide care for people with a substance use disorder (or facilities that are administratively tracked for other reasons). In general, facilities reporting TEDS data are those that receive state alcohol and/or drug agency funds (including federal block grant funds) for the provision of alcohol and/or drug treatment services.

### University of Michigan's Monitoring the Future (MTF)

- *Monitoring the Future* is an ongoing study of the behaviors, attitudes, and values of Americans from adolescence through adulthood. Each year, a total of approximately 50,000 8th, 10th and 12th grade students are surveyed (12th graders since 1975, and 8th and 10th graders since 1991). In addition, annual follow-up questionnaires are mailed to a sample of each graduating class for a number of years after their initial participation. The Monitoring the Future Study has been funded under a series of investigator-initiated competing research grants from the National Institute on Drug Abuse, a part of the National Institutes of Health. MTF is conducted at the Survey Research Center in the Institute for Social Research at the University of Michigan.

### Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System (YRBSS)

- The Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System (YRBSS) monitors six categories of health-related behaviors that contribute to the leading causes of death and disability among youth and adults, including
  - Behaviors that contribute to unintentional injuries and violence



YRBSS, continued:

- Sexual behaviors related to unintended pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV infection
- Alcohol and other drug use
- Tobacco use
- Unhealthy dietary behaviors
- Inadequate physical activity

YRBSS also measures the prevalence of obesity and asthma and other health-related behaviors plus sexual identity and sex of sexual contacts. YRBSS includes a national school-based survey conducted by CDC and state, territorial, tribal, and local surveys conducted by state, territorial, and local education and health agencies and tribal governments.
