
Policy Change in Prevention: A Review

Why Policy?

- Comprehensive, environmental prevention approach focused broadly on community and society
- Creates environment that supports non-use or reductions in use
- Sustainable and efficient
- Responsive to new substances and changing attitudes







"Policy" vs. "policy"


Policy

- Environmental strategies at the society and community levels
- Written and official; may be voted on by elected/appointed officials
- Broad power of enforcement applies to everyone to ensure adherence


policy

- Environmental strategies at organizational level; principles that guide behavior
- May or may not be written
- Powers of enforcement apply to those within setting/system

Policy Development Best Practices

- Identify Risk & Protective Factors
- Assess Readiness & Will
- Collaborative
- Monitor & Evaluate







Evidence-Based Policy Categories to Prevent Youth Substance Use

- Retail and social (Access)
- Age for purchase (Access)
- Price or taxes on product
- Limits to advertising/promotion
- Media Literacy education
- Enforcement of laws for sales, where use, advertising

Tobacco Use Risk Factors

- Having parents, siblings, or friends who smoke
- Exposure/availability
- Older age
- Male gender
- Race/ethnicity
- Lacking a plan to attend college
- Parents who did not attend college
- Having experienced a stressful event





Tobacco Use Risk Factors & Policy Strategies

Tobacco Risk Factor	Policies
Availability/Access	Access limits Price increases Location limits on use
Exposure to smokers in social environment (parents, siblings, friends)	Location limits on use Promotion policies
Having experienced a stressful event	Promotion (address individual-, peer-level)





Common Tobacco Prevention Policies

- Minimum age (18, 19, or 21) to purchase
- Location and density restrictions on businesses/sales (licensing requirements)
- Training and enforcement of vendors/servers sales to minors
- Advertising restrictions or bans
- Prohibitions on sponsoring public events
- Enforcement via compliance checks/penalties on sales to youth
- Price/tax rates

Tobacco Prevention Policies in Your Community



Examples Across Region 2

Tobacco Free for a Healthy New Jersey

- Regulating the sale of e-cigarettes & other electronic nicotine delivery systems
- Restricting the sale of menthol & other flavored tobacco products
- Implementing content-neutral advertising laws

Recent state laws:

- Tobacco 21: New Jersey and New York
- Prohibit indoor e-cigarette use:
 Puerto Rico
- Require retail license to sell ecigarettes: USVI





Marijuana Risk Factors

- Perception of positive consequences of marijuana use
- Availability
- Community norms favorable to marijuana use and sensation seeking
- Permissive school-level norms
- Exposure to violence





Marijuana Risk Factors & Policy Strategies

Risk Factor	Policies
Availability	Access limits Price increases Location policies re: availability/access
Community norms favorable to marijuana use and sensation seeking	Promotion policies (anti-promotion) Enforcement
Permissive school-level norms	Enforcement
Exposure to violence	Promotion policies (mental health services access) Enforcement



Common Marijuana Prevention Policies

- Age of purchase (21)
- Restricted access (not allowed in retail shops, home storage requirements)
- Price/taxation rates
- Advertising/promotion limits or bans
- Limitations on packaging, labeling, flavors, dosage, and amounts sold
- Enforcement of ban on sales to minors
- Licensing/limitations on retail shop locations, density, and ownership

Vaping Risk Factors

- Tobacco Risk Factors
 - Availability
 - Norm (Level of exposure to smokers in the social environment)
 - Having experienced stressful event
- Marijuana Risk Factors
 - Availability
 - Community norms favorable to marijuana use and sensation seeking
 - Permissive school-level norms
 - Exposure to violence






Environmental Strategies & Vaping Risk Factors

Tobacco Risk Factor	Policies
Availability/Access	Access, Price, Location policies
Level of exposure to smokers in the social environment	Location, Promotion policies
Having experienced stressful	Promotion (address individual,
event	peer level)

Marijuana Risk Factor	Policies
Availability/Access	Access, Price, Location Policies
Community norms favorable to	Location, Promotion policies
use	
Exposure to violence	Promotion policies, Enforcement





Common Vaping Prevention Policies

- Age of sales/use of product and related supplies
- Price/taxation rates
- Advertising/promotion limits or bans
- Enforcement of ban on sales to minors
- Licensing/limitations for access to product
- Limitations on location for use (smoke free)



Policy Best Practices


- Identify & Address Risk & Protective Factors
- Focus at community & societal level supports efforts at individual and family/peer levels. Also supports across lifespan/developmental stages
- Use a comprehensive, environmental approach (more effective when combined with other interventions, no single intervention will achieve outcome)
- Build on collaboration and partnership (Assess community readiness, build support, etc.)
- Follows process: development, enactment, implementation, monitoring & enforcement
- Evaluate efforts for process and outcome results

- Enactment
- Implementation
- Monitoring & Enforcement






