County Health Rankings and Roadmaps

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This website provides you with data sources on all states. Select your state to find state-specific resources. Some resources are also available at the county level. At the bottom of your state's page, you will also find links to community resources such as the Department of Health and Welfare.

National Risk and Protective Factor Data

American Community Survey

Annual survey that provides social, economic, housing, and demographic characteristic data available at national, state, county, and city level.

<u>Advancing Science & Practice in the Retail Environment (ASPiRE): An NCI-Funded Center – Tobacco Retailers</u>

For tobacco control interventions, this site provides national data with some specific city data (Portland, OR & Seattle, WA). See maps that illustrate where tobacco retailers are.

Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS)

CDC survey of U.S. residents regarding "health-related risk behaviors, chronic health conditions, and use of preventive services."

Child Trends

Research organization which aims to improve child and youth development using evidence-based programs and policies.

City-Data

City-Data collects data from different sources and creates profiles of cities in the U.S. Data is categorized by city, school, neighborhood, assessment, and restaurants.

Diversitydatakids.org

Equity-focused research to "help improve child wellbeing and increase racial and ethnic equity in opportunities for children." Datasets range from national to neighborhood level data.

Explore Census Data

The U.S. Census collects data from each resident in the U.S. every decade. Data is available at national, regional, state, and county levels.

Healthy People

Interactive tool to locate data on public health topic areas at national and state level.

High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas (HIDTA)

HIDTA provides information on regional drug threats to help reduce drug trafficking and production. To find your HIDTA contact visit https://www.hidtaprogram.org/index.php.

KIDS COUNT

Collects data on children and families to assess wellbeing. National, state, county, and city level data are available.

Monitoring the Future

Annual survey of 8th, 10th, and 12th grade students.

National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH)

Measures use of illegal drugs, prescription drugs, alcohol, and tobacco, misuse of prescription drugs, substance use disorder and treatment, and mental illness. "Data provides estimates of substance use and mental illness at national, state, and substate levels."

National Center for Children in Poverty

Data and policy tools to examine demographic, policy, and risk and protective factor data by state or region.

Overdose Detection Mapping Application Program (ODMAP)

Real-time suspected overdose surveillance data.

School Health Profiles

Also known as Profiles, this biennial survey assesses "school health policies and practices" in states, school districts, and territories.

Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS)

This survey monitors six categories of health-related risk behaviors among students.
