


Evaluation Framework



Describe the Theory of Change

Theory of Change (TOC)

...a comprehensive description and illustration of how and why a desired change is expected to happen in a particular context (Center for Theory of Change, 2023).

TOC Includes Risk and Protective Factors





Risk Factors

A characteristic at the biological, psychological, family, community, or cultural level that precedes and is associated with a higher likelihood of problem outcomes

Protective Factors


A characteristic at the biological, psychological, family, or community (including peers and culture) level that is associated with a lower likelihood of problem outcomes or that reduces the negative impact of a risk factor on problem outcomes.



Pulling It Together

Priorities

Needs: Increasing numbers of students are expressing suicidal ideation.

Goal: Reduce suicide attempts.

Objectives:

- 1) Improve recognition of signs of suicide.
- 2) Increase help-seeking.
- 3) Reduce suicidal thoughts.

<u>Inputs</u>

- 1) Develop teaching materials
- 2) Identify and adapt screenin tool
- 3) Identify clinical staff
- 4) Obtain parent permission

Outputs

Activities:

- 1) Train clinical staff
- 2) Teach how to recognize signs of depression and suicide
- 3) Model help-seeking behavior
- 4) Assess for depression
- 5) Follow-up and referral based on assessment

Participants:

- 1) Students and parents participate in education components
- 2) Students' complete assessment forms
- 3) School staff refer at-risk students to follow-up

<u>Outcomes</u>

- 1) Improved recognition of signs of depression and suicide
- 2) Increases in help seeking behavior
- 3) Reductions in suicidal thoughts
- 4) Reduction in suicide attempts
