

#### Drug Use and Gun Violence

- The majority of individuals arrested in Cook County, Illinois, including gun related offenses, were under the influence of drugs at the time of arrest.
  - Five hundred annual homicides, 3000 annual shootings
- John Hopkins University's School of Public Health reveals that alcohol plays a significant role in firearm fatalities. The study indicated:
  - 33% of homicides perpetrators were under the influence of drugs at the time of the homicide
  - 30% of homicide victims were under the influence of drugs at the time of the homicide

#### Gun Violence in Urban and Rural Areas



"Gun violence in urban areas has been declining the past several decades. The one type of gun violence that remains constant is suicide by gun in rural America when jobs go away. These suicides often involve a combination of alcohol and firearms."

#### Driving Under the Influence and Gun Violence



Two or more alcohol-related driving under the influence convictions increases the risk of gun violence, including intimate partner gun violence.

## 21 Additional Risk Factors For Gun Violence

#### Risk Factor: Male Depression

Unique features of male depression:

- Lack of capacity to feel
- Externalization of pain
- Feelings of inadequacy without hope

- Suicide that looks like a homicide

- Abuse
- A lake of love
- Rejection
- Stability constantly threatened



#### Risk Factor: Father/Son Pain



- The absence of a caring father
- The presence of an abusive father

- My family let me down
- My community let me down
- The larger community let me down
  - Shipping jobs abroad
  - Low wages
  - Discrimination
  - Societal mixed messages

Dehumanizing Experiences


- Police stops
- Police brutality
- Arrests
- Followed while shopping
- Poor to no customer service
- Left to die by paramedics
- Community humiliation

- Death of close relatives
- Friend(s) murdered
- Father or mother hunger
- Parent deported
- Parental divorce
- Frequent relocations



- Relationship builder







#### Magician

The man who pulls a rabbit out of a hat, negotiator, creative problem solver

#### **Shadow King**

Corrupt leader, dictator



#### **Shadow Warrior**

- Bully, gang member, rage-a-holic
- Quick temper, violence prone



#### **Shadow Lover**

- Serial affairs
- Hurtful without consideration of other's feelings



#### Shadow Magician

- Con artist
- Manipulator



#### Risk Factors #10-14

- 10. Difficulty expressing feelings
- 11. Educational frustration
- 12. Gang or hate group affiliation
- 13. Lack of future orientation
- 14. A history of trauma

- 18. History of incarceration

- 21. Dropping out of school, being bullied at school

## Gun Violence Among Adolescent Girls and Women

### Research on Gun Violence Among Adolescent Girls and Women

- Girls involved in gangs are rarely perpetrators of gun violence. They are more likely to buy and stash guns for male gang members. (<u>Thousands of Girl Gang Members are Trapped in a Cycle of Violence and Abuse</u>, Darcy Jimenez, 2019)
- 6,000 American women die each year from gun violence. More than 50% are suicides. (Women Impacted by Gun Violence: "We Don't Have To Live Like This", Jennifer Gerson, 2024)
- 80% of homicide victims of intimate partner violence are women (11 Statistics That Remind Us Gun Violence Is a Women's Issue, Jenavieve Hatch, 2017)
- Women who experience intimate partner violence are most vulnerable to gun related homicide the first two years after they leave their partner (<u>The</u> <u>Battered Woman Syndrome</u>, Lenore Walker, EdD, 2016)

### Research on Gun Violence Among Adolescent Girls and Women, Continued


- When women believe they cannot stop the violence and previous efforts to escape were unsuccessful, some will commit homicide against the perpetrator (The Battered Woman Syndrome, Lenore Walker, EdD, 2016)
- Women in the U.S. who are pregnant or have recently given birth are more likely to die of intimate partner gun violence than from hypertensive disorders, hemorrhage, or sepsis (<u>Homicide Leading Cause of Death for Pregnant</u> <u>Women in U.S.</u>, Harvard School of Public Health, 2022)




# Orientation and Purpose



# More Prevention and Intervention Strategies

- Outlets for anger and rage (<u>Teens Who Hurt</u>, Kenneth Hardy, Ph.D.)
- Help males develop a feeling vocabulary (I Don't Want to Talk About It, Terrence Real, Ph.D.)
- Therapy to address issues of abandonment and rejection (Lost Boys, James Garbarino, Ph.D.)
- Address dehumanization and ignored losses (Teens Who Hurt, Kenneth Hardy, Ph.D.)

# Intervention Strategies

- Group processing of dehumanizing experiences
- Rituals to honor losses
- Experiential exercises to address rage
- Help with substance use
- Violence interrupters and truce negotiators

# A Problem-solving Approach


- What is the problem?

- What are the options for solving the problem?
- What are the plusses and minuses of each option?
- Which option is best?
- What will you do?

# Head and Heart Alignment

- When making decisions, it is often helpful to use your head and your heart:
  - What is your head telling you to do in this situation?
  - What is your heart saying?
- You can tell when you are making a good decision because your body is often calm.
- As soon as you realize you are making a bad decision, reverse it as soon as possible and make a good decision.
